#### Dear Parents and Families,

Happy Halloween and congratulations on completing the first quarter of this year! It has been a busy nine weeks and a welcome return to many of the events and experiences that are so important to our community. I have included here a 13-minute video of some of the <a href="SJV Highlights of 1st Quarter">SJV Highlights of 1st Quarter</a>, including Home & School Walkathon 2021, Middle School Retreat, Weekly All-School Mass in church, our Whitecaps outing, Blessing of the Pets, All-School Rosary and the everyday moments that make our community special. The smiles in these pictures tell a beautiful story of our community and the joy we share in being together.



I am also sending an update on our MAPS scores for Fall, 2021, which is another part of our story. You'll see that our accomplishments include scoring significantly above national norms in all 25 tests across 7 grades as well as outpacing diocesan averages in 22 out of 25 tests. For those new to MAPS testing, our students take MAPS tests three times a year and scores from these tests are used to measure each student's academic growth, to plan effective instruction, and to provide a measurement of academic performance compared to national and diocesan averages. This test is adaptive, which means that it responds to each student's responses. Correct responses lead to more difficult levels of questions until a student's top performance is reached. They are also untimed, allowing students to demonstrate learning at their own pace. We test three times a year to provide timely data to inform our instruction and provide this kind of performance feedback to students. Next week, we will send home with students in grades 2-8 a copy of your child's Fall NWEA MAP report.

I also want to thank Jeri Spencer and Jim Hurst, who along with Katie Kiser, our consultant from All Belong, presented a parent program which explained the supports in place for students at SJV. Terry Terrell, President, and Nellie Richthammer, Admissions Director from Catholic Central High School also discussed how these supports follow students through high school, providing a seamless transition. We are so grateful for the blessing of these partnerships to provide a caring, consistent level of support pre-K through 12, to welcome and nurture all of our students. If you have questions, let's talk! We welcome the chance to meet individually to best serve our students.

Looking ahead, we are celebrating All Saints Day with our annual 5th Grade Wax Museum event where 5th graders research and teach students about the lives of saints. This is always an inspiring event. We will celebrate school Mass on our regular day next week, Thursday, 11/4. We will honor our veterans at our school mass on Veterans' Day, 11/11. Family members and friends who are veterans are invited to attend Mass with us, with blessing and a brief reception following in Village Hall. Families are also encouraged to bring photos of the veterans they would like to honor to school by Tuesday, 11/9. These will be displayed during mass.

Tomorrow's Halloween celebrations will end first quarter with lots of laughter and good memories. As always, we want to avoid costumes that are scary or not in keeping with our Catholic values. Thank you for helping us SHINE in every way.

#### **Description of the Awards**

- The <u>"Service to SJV Award"</u> is given annually to the St. John Vianney employee or volunteer who has consistently served the SJV community in an extraordinary fashion or whose efforts during the past calendar year were exceptional.
- The <u>"Lifetime Service to SJV Award"</u> honors an individual who has provided a very unique level of service to the parish over a significantly long period of time. #### **Selection Committee**

The St. John Vianney Foundation Board and the Gala Planning Committee which includes representation from various backgrounds in the SJV community.

#### Criteria for Selection

The following criteria will be considered by the Selection Committee when determining the award recipient:

A significant history of service to the SJV community as a volunteer or employee over many years.

A unique or extraordinary level of service to the SJV community in terms of the hours of work or service.

Service as a chair, co-chair, or key committee member of a particularly important church, school or SJV community program or event.

Assistance to the church, school or SJV community in addressing and resolving a particularly difficult issue, challenge or situation.

Any other outstanding qualities or examples of service that uniquely contributed to the success of the SJV community.

You may nominate individuals for the Service to SJV Award and/or the Lifetime service to SJV Award.
